The Fabric of Survival: The Art of Esther Nisenthal Krinitz

New Exhibition at the OZ Gallery January 26 to May 26



In 1942, when the Nazis ordered the Jews of the town of Mniszek in Poland to report for "relocation," 15-year-old Esther Nisenthal and her 13-year-old sister broke away from the rest of the villagers and evaded the Gestapo by pretending to be Catholic farm girls. After the war, Esther married a fellow survivor and moved to the United States. At age 50, she began creating works of art using fabric and yarns to share her story of enduring the Holocaust. *The*

Fabric of Survival is a traveling exhibition composed of high-quality photographic reproductions of the original fabric work of Esther Krinitz circulated by Art and Remembrance (<https://artandremembrance.org/about/esther-krinitz/>).




Talmud & Siddur Classes with Rabbi Bolton

OZ Book Discussion Sunday, Jan. 27, 7:30-9:30 pm

Congregant Charlie Spielholz will lead the discussion on *The Undoing Project: A Friendship That Changed Our Minds*, by Michael Lewis. Forty years ago, Israeli psychologists Daniel Kahneman and Amos Tversky wrote a series of original papers that invented the field of behavioral economics. One of the greatest partnerships in the history of science, Kahneman and

Tversky's extraordinary friendship incited a revolution in Big Data studies, advanced evidence-based medicine, and led to a new approach to government regulation. In *The Undoing Project*, Lewis shows how their Nobel Prize-winning theory of the mind altered our perception of reality (Goodreads.com).

The Lucy S. Dawidowicz Lecture Thursday, Feb. 7, 7:30 pm

This year's annual lecture will feature Christine Hayes, PhD, who will deliver an address about her landmark book, *What's so Divine About Divine Law?* She is the Robert F. & Patricia Ross Weis Professor of Religious Studies, Yale University. Before joining the Yale faculty in 1996, Dr. Hayes was Assistant Professor of Hebrew Studies in the Department of Near Eastern

Studies at Princeton University for three years. Her published works include several books and many articles in *Vetus Testamentum*, *The Journal for the Study of Judaism*, *The Harvard Theological Review*.
