
TALMUD CLASS BEGINS



The Spirit of Hanukkah

(() ot by might and not by power, but by My Spirit, says the Lord of Hosts." This is the resounding message of the haftarah for the Shabbat of Hanukkah. Despite the overtly military history underlying the holiday, it is the spirit that we emphasize. The Maccabees staged a successful revolt against the Syrian rulers of second-century BCE Israel, who had severely restricted the practice of Jewish rites. The apocryphal books of the Maccabees report in detail the politics and strategy of the revolt. But the Talmudic tradition placed a greater emphasis on the miracles relating

to the rededication of the Temple, the most famous of which is the burning of a single day's allotment of oil for eight days.

Even by the time of the Talmud, a few hundred years after the Maccabees, the military achievement had lost some of its luster in the collective memory. But the resurgence of Jewish life that resulted from our victory remained then, and remains now, a powerful example of the persistence of our tradition. Rulers, wars, and even temples come and go, but Jewish life renews itself in the dedicated acts of those who defend it and carry the flame forward.

The beautiful photos in the book portray the traditional way of life followed by the Yemeni Jewish community, a quickly diminishing population. The book opens with Ozeri's personal prologue, recounting family

members' long history in Yemen and their aliyah "on the wings of eagles" two years before his birth. Zion Ozeri will share insights on his Yemeni heritage and on the use of art and photography for moral education.

Book discussions will resume their ordinary schedule for the following meeting at 7:30 p.m. on Sunday, January 22, 2006.

YAD VASHEM: A CALL TO ACTION

🚺 ad Vashem is issuing an urgent call to action, asking the Jewish world to join their I international 11th-hour campaign to collect the names of Holocaust victims and submit them to the Central Database of Shoah Victims' Names Database. In the months since the database was launched, almost four and a half million visitors from 183 countries have entered the website, and Yad Vashem has received 23,000 new Pages of Testimony and 400 photographs. However, nearly three million names are still missing.
