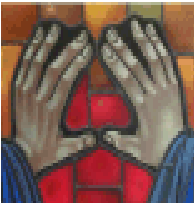

Your voice, your spirit and your presence are the essentials.

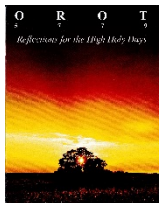
