Each of us has our own questions that we come to the Yamim Noraim with. Come

listen to fellow Congregant Dr. Barry Collier share reflections about the inquiries he has made, as he approached the Yamim Noraim and crafted articles for Or Zarua's Congregant-written and edited journal.

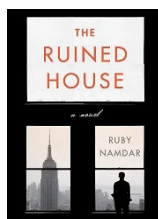
