Musical Havdalah and Jazz Set with Michael Schwartz

Saturday evening, Jan. 18, 6:00 pm

Michael will be performing jazz arrangements of some of the standards from the "Great American Songbook" and some important jazz originals that are less familiar. The jazz artist whose compositions he will feature is the late pianist Thelonious Monk.



Lucy S. Dawidowicz Lecture Wednesday, Jan. 29, 7:30 pm

"Edith Stein: Jewish Apostate and Catholic Saint" with Leora Batnitzky, PhD. This lecture considers the contested legacies of the Jewish apostate and Catholic saint, Edith Stein.

Murdered at Auschwitz in 1942 because of her Jewish lineage, Stein was subsequently canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1998. Her legacy remains a point of painful and heated disagreement between Jews and Catholics. What can we learn from the controversy about Stein's identity regarding the complex historical and theological relationship between Judaism and Christianity? And what can we learn from Stein's life about the power and limitations of empathy?



Dr. Leora Batnitzky is the Ronald O. Perelman Professor of Jewish Studies at Princeton University. Her teaching and research interests include philosophy of religion, modern Jewish thought, hermeneutics, and contemporary legal and political theory. In 2002 she received Princeton's President's Award for Distinguished Teaching.

Siddur Class. Thursdays, 8:40-9:40 am (no class Dec. 26 or Jan. 2). *When Prayer and Remembering Meet: Yizkor, Funeral Rites, Daily Psalms and Reminders.*

Explore the themes and language of our Yizkor prayers, as well as funeral liturgies. In general the class explores the history, forms, content and meaning of Jewish liturgy and prayer rites.
