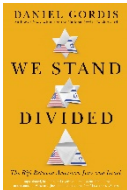
"**Edith Stein: Jewish Apostate and Catholic Saint**" with Leora Batnitzky, PhD. This lecture considers the contested legacies of the Jewish apostate and Catholic saint, Edith Stein. Murdered at Auschwitz in 1942 because of her Jewish lineage, Stein was subsequently canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1998. Her legacy remains a point of heated disagreement between Jews and Catholics. What can we learn from the controversy about Stein's identity regarding the complex relationship between Judaism and Christianity? What can we learn from Stein's life about the power and limitations of empathy?



Dr. Leora Batnitzky is the Ronald O. Perelman Professor of Jewish Studies at Princeton University. Her teaching and research interests include philosophy of religion, modern Jewish thought, hermeneutics, and contemporary legal and political theory. In 2002 she received Princeton's President's Award for Distinguished Teaching.
