Purim mitzvah of Matanot LaEvyonim, giving gifts to the needy:

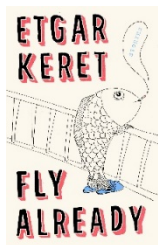
1. Write a check to Or Zarua with "Matanot LaEvyonim" in the memo line
