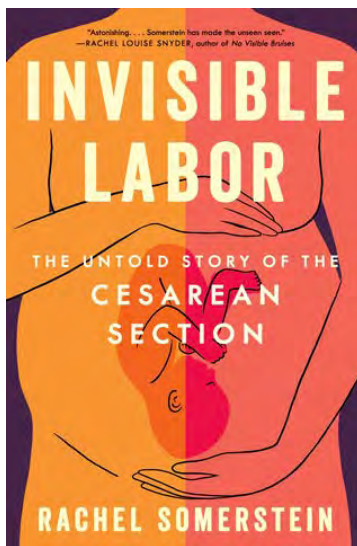

BOOK TALK WITH PROFESSOR RACHEL SOMERSTEIN

What's interesting about Jewish motherhood and Judaic approaches to pregnancy and fertility is that they really do differ from the American ideal. This talk, which draws on personal, historical, Talmudic, and other sources, explores the surprising ways that a close look at Judaic interpretations, presentations, and practices of midwifery, pregnancy, and birth both challenge and expose the limitations of the American ideal. It closes with a discussion of how activists, lawyers, and other advocates have interpreted the Dobbs decision as an infringement on Jewish religious liberty.

Rachel Somerstein is a journalist and social scientist with a PhD in mass communications and an MFA in creative writing who uses data, history, and reporting to tell stories that drive public policy and the public conversation, particularly regarding maternal health. Her critically-acclaimed book:

[Invisible Labor: The Untold Story of the Cesarean Section](#), which blends research, reporting, history, and memoir, is now out from Ecco.

Rachel's work has appeared in publications including the Boston Globe, the Guardian, the Washington Post, and Women's Health and has been featured on NPR's "Fresh Air." She lives in the Hudson Valley with her family.

"THE LOST SHETEL," BY MAX GROSS

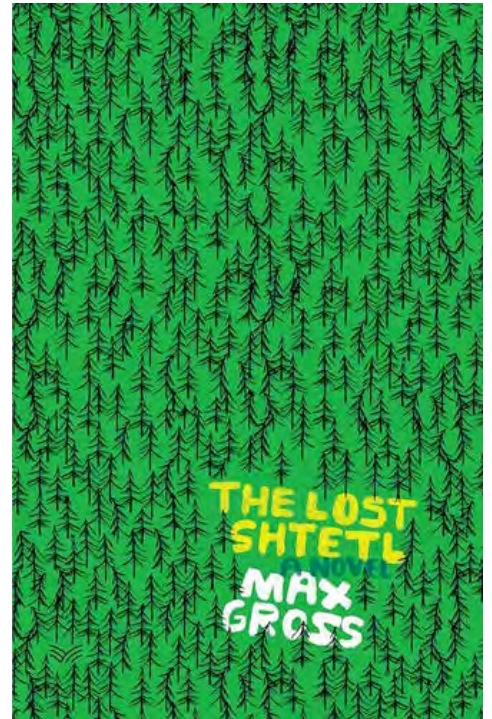

What if there was a town that history missed?

For decades, the tiny Jewish shtetl of Kreskol existed in happy isolation, virtually untouched and unchanged. Spared by the Holocaust and the Cold War, its residents enjoyed remarkable peace. It missed out on cars, and electricity, and the internet, and indoor plumbing. But when a marriage dispute spins out of control, the whole town comes crashing into the twenty-first century. Pesha Lindauer, who has just suffered an ugly, acrimonious divorce, suddenly disappears. A day later, her husband goes after her, setting off a panic among the town elders. They send a woefully unprepared outcast named Yankel Lewinkopf out into the wider world to alert the Polish authorities.

Venturing beyond the remote safety of Kreskol, Yankel is confronted by the beauty and the ravages of the modern-day outside world – and his reception is met with a confusing mix of disbelief, condescension, and unexpected kindness. When the truth eventually surfaces, his story and the existence of Kreskol make headlines nationwide.

Returning Yankel to Kreskol, the Polish government plans to reintegrate the town that time forgot. Yet in doing so, the devious origins of its disappearance come to the light. And what has become of the mystery of Pesha and her former husband? Divided between those embracing change and those clinging to its old world ways, the people of Kreskol will have to find a way to come together . . . or risk their village disappearing for good.

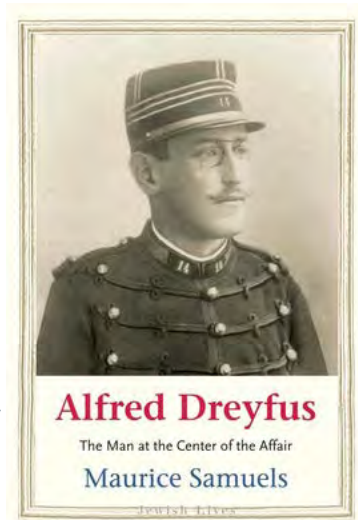
LUCY S. DAWIDOWICZ LECTURE

"ANTISEMITISM AND THE JEWISH PRESENCE IN FRANCE:
PAST, PRESENT, & FUTURE"

WITH DR. MAURICE SAMUELS, YALE UNIVERSITY

Wednesday, January 29, 7:00 pm

Antisemitism in France is a complex tapestry woven with threads of prejudice, political intrigue, and cultural narratives. Jewish history in France is marked by a range of experiences for the community—from periods of coexistence and prosperity to eras of persecution and violence. Dr. Maurice Samuels has explored the historical record from times when Jews faced systemic discrimination, forced conversions, and violent pogroms to being welcomed during the period of the Enlightenment and the French Revolution. The 19th and 20th centuries brought a new wave of antisemitism, characterized by the Dreyfus Affair which Samuels charts in his book about Dreyfus. The episode not only exposed deep-seated prejudices but also mobilized public opinion and saw the emergence of modern antisemitism in a secular context. Dr. Samuels will help expand our thought about Jews' places in both France and the modern world as he looks at the particulars in the case of the French Jewish community. Grappling with the resurgence of antisemitism in the late 20th and early 21st centuries this lecture will explore the historical backdrop and allow us to address questions such as why does antisemitism persist? And what lessons can we draw from the past to combat discrimination in our time?



Maurice Samuels is the Betty Jane Anlyan Professor of French and Chair of the French Department at Yale University, where he also directs the Yale Program for the Study of Antisemitism. A recipient of the Guggenheim Fellowship and the Cullman Center Fellowship at the New York Public Library, he is the author of five books, including most recently "Alfred Dreyfus: The Man at the Center of the Affair," published in 2024 by Yale University Press in the Jewish Lives Series.

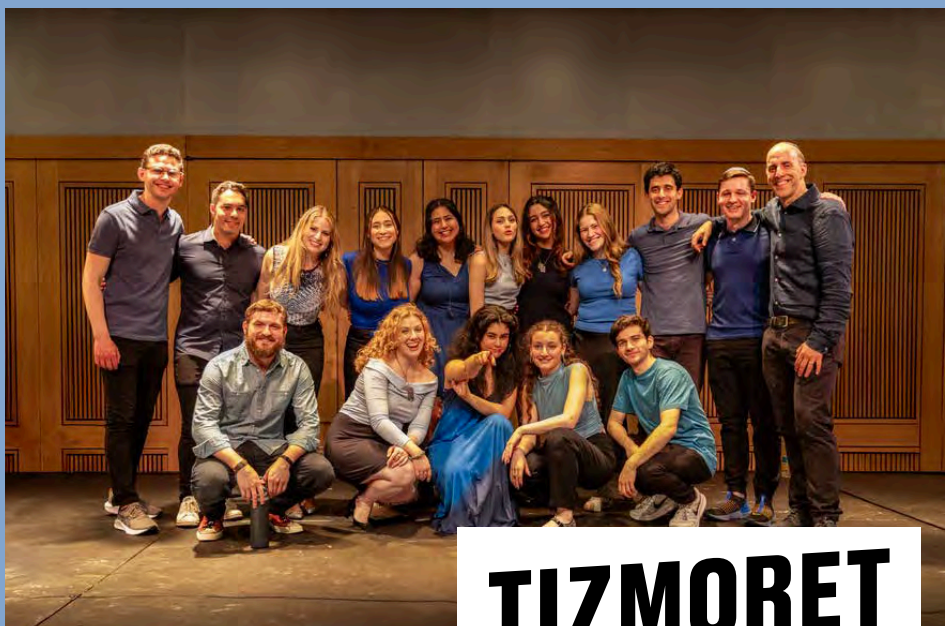

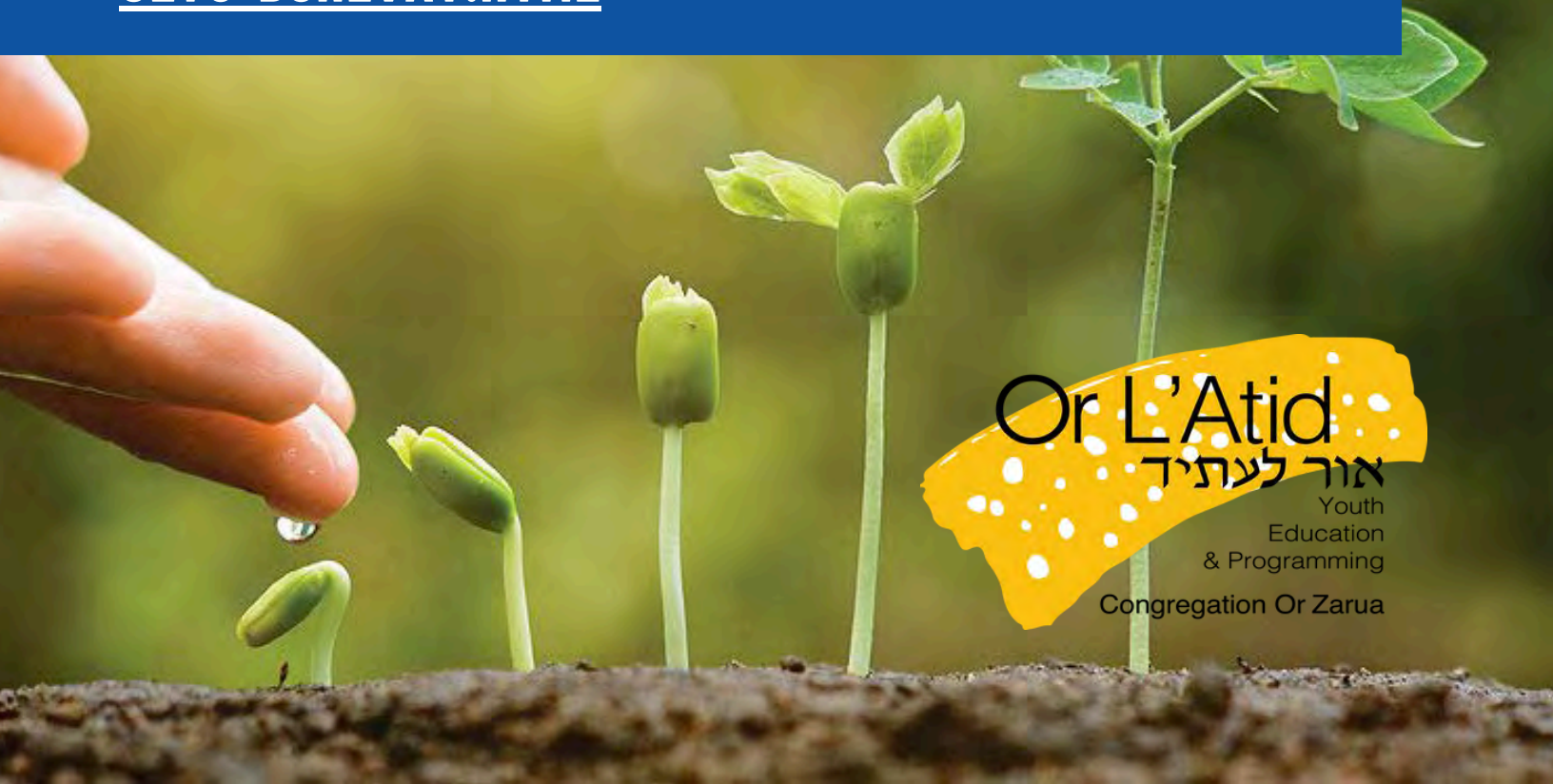

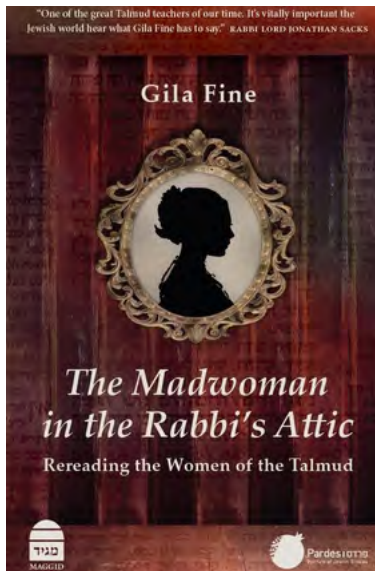

THE MADWOMAN IN THE RABBI'S ATTIC: REREADING THE WOMEN OF THE TALMUD

How does the Talmud portray its heroines?

Why are they never as they first seem?

And what does this tell us about the rabbis' views of marriage, sex, childbirth, and what it means to be a woman in the world?

Gila Fine discusses her new book which explores the six named heroines of the Talmud: Yalta, Homa, Marta, Heruta, Bruria and Ima Shalom.

Gila Fine is a lecturer of rabbinic literature at the Pardes Institute of Jewish Studies, exploring the tales of the Talmud through philosophy, literary criticism, psychoanalysis, and pop-culture. She is the recipient of the Maimonides Award for Excellence in Jewish Education, and serves on the faculties of the Nachshon Project, Amudim Seminary, the Tikvah Scholars Program, and the London School of Jewish Studies, in addition to teaching thousands of students at conferences, campuses, and communities across the Jewish world. Haaretz has called her “a young woman on her way to becoming one of the more outstanding Jewish thinkers of the next generation.”

Gila's new book, *The Madwoman in the Rabbi's Attic: Rereading the Women of the Talmud*, won the 2024 Rabbi Sacks Book Prize.
