The joyous festival of Sukkot (סוכרת) begins on Friday evening, September 27th. Sukkot is one of the three pilgrimage festivals mentioned in the Torah. On Sukkot, we are commanded to repose in a Sukkah, take the "arba minim" (four species, composed of lulay, etrog, hadassim and ar-

High Holy Days begin Friday evening, Sept. 13th

The Jewish New Year,
Rosh Hashanah (ראש השנה),
begins on Friday evening,
September 13th. Or Zarua will
hold day and evening services
for Rosh Hashanah and Yom
Kippur (יום כפור) at the auditorium at 60 East 78th Street
(between Park and Madison
Avenues) which will be specially outfitted for the occasion.
A complete schedule of High
Holy Day services is on Page
11.

This year, because the first day of Rosh Hashanah falls on Shabbat, the shofar will not be sounded until the second day. In addition, the observance of the custom of Tashlikh is deferred to Sunday afternoon. Following Tashlikh, an evening service, marking the conclusion of Rosh Hashanah, is scheduled for 7 p.m. at 127 East 82nd St.




Summer Services at Or Zarua
