Hanukkah Commences Sunday Evening, December 9th

Hanukkah commences on Sunday evening, December 9th, which is the 25th of Kislev. The traditional association of the lighting of the Hanukkah lights with the Hasmonean revolt against the Hellenic rule and desecration of the Second Temple is well known. It was on the 25th of Kislev that the victorious Hasmoneans entered the temple and found enough oil for the menorah that they lit to burn for one day. It burned for eight. Some say that the work "Hanukkah" is derived from the word "Hanu" meaning "they rested", and the letters "kaf-he", the numerical value of which is 25. (Rabbi Solomon Ganzfried, Code of Jewish Law.)

Hanukkah is a time for latkes, menorahs, jelly donuts and candles. As you light the candles each night, you add another candle to the menorah. Although hanukkiot come in a variety of shapes, technically all of the candles (other than the shamash) should be in a straight line and at the same height. The hanukkiah should be placed in a window or door so that it is visible from the outside. While three barachot are recited the first night, two barachot are said on the other nights.

On Sunday, September 9th, Or Zarua members of all ages, from young children to senior citizens, brought their good cheer and holiday wishes to the Second Annual Rosh Hashanah Food Package Delivery to the East-Side Elderly. DOROT provided names and addresses to the group, and a half-hour orientation for new participants. Then the volunteers were on their way to visit their assigned individuals - along with shopping bags of scrumptious holiday food. Congregants met for about an hour with each person or couple they visited. It was hard to tell what the seniors appreciated more, the time devoted to meeting and talking with the OZ volunteers, or the anticipation of eating the "goodies" in the DOROT shopping bag. Looking in on homebound or alone elderly just prior to the High Holy Days was a wonderful act of hesed that was truly appreciated by all participants. Thanks to Aaron Shelden for organizing the event.

Hebrew School News

The opening of the school year has been a very exciting time. Our school has grown this year, with many new students in the younger grades, and a full contingent in the older grades. Students have already begun their studies of Hebrew, of ancient and modern Jewish History, of Torah and of Jewish ethics.

Our students studied concepts of forgiveness for the holidays of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Many students visited the synagogue's Sukkah during Sukkot, and had an opportunity to shake the Lulav and Etrog. They learned or reviewed the relevance of Simkhat Torah, the celebration of Torah when we complete D'varim, Deuteronomy, and begin again with B'reishit, Genesis.

September and October seemed to fly by in the wake of terror, so closely followed by our season of forgiveness and renewal. I hope that as November and December settle on us, as the season changes and the weather turns, that our lives will take on a more peaceful mode. Our children will spend the next months immersed in their Hebrew learning, and they will be participating in various projects of G'milut Khasidim — acts of loving kindness — in our Jewish community and around the greater New York community. For example, the older students will have the opportunity to participate in Teensgiving, a program run by the 92nd Street Y, where they volunteer all over Manhattan for different projects.

I look forward to the opportunity to meet more OZ congregants and parents and to talk to you about our Hebrew School. Several parents have made some wonderful suggestions to me in the past weeks about ways to make our Hebrew School better. I appreciate these suggestions, and hope you keep sharing your ideas with me. It is my hope that in the coming year, our students strengthen their Jewish identity through knowledge of our beautiful language and our shared history.

Voter Registration for World Zionist Congress Elections

MERCAZ USA, the voice of American Conservative Jews for Israel, needs your vote for delegates to the June, 2002 World Zionist Congress. This 34th Congress will take place in Jerusalem

This election determines 50% of the control of the Jewish Agency that disperses over \$300 million in funds to many organizations including USY, Ramah, and Masorti. All American Jews over 18 are eligible to register. There is a \$4 fee that goes towards offsetting the cost of the election. Registration ends on December 15, 2001 followed by balloting.

- d. I reside on a full-time, permanent basis in the U.S.
- 2) Each individual must complete his/her own form, which may be photocopied, but an individual may register only once. Duplicates will be invalidated. Each registration must be mailed in its own envelope and postmarked no later than December 14, 2001.
- 3) Enclose a \$4.00 payment. Payment can be made with registrant's personal check for \$4.00, payable to the American Zionist Movement, or by credit card. (The credit card must be in the name of the registrant and must be a personal, not corporate or institutional, credit card.) Neither cash nor money orders will be accepted. No ballot will be sent if the registration fee is not paid. Should the election be deferred or cancelled, refunds cannot be made. You may also register on-line. Go to www.azm.org to find the link to the secured registration site. You may only use a credit card for on-line registration.
