Chevra Kadisha: A Lifeline to the Synagogue Community

In Judaism, death is part of life. One of the best ways to participate in the life of our synagogue is to assist is the rituals and customs surrounding the death of members or their loved ones.

By joining shiva minyans at the house of mourning, arranging for food and prayer books to be delivered, or providing information about religious practice, members of the Or Zarua Chevra Kadisha (burial society), founded a little over a year ago, come to know the bereaved (and through them, the departed) in significant ways which are absent in more joyful or superficial situations.

Chevra Kadisha members also act as shomrim, reciting Psalms beside the coffin

before the funeral. Members prepare the deceased for burial: they ritually clean the body, dress it in shrouds, and place it in the casket. Those who have assisted at this ritual, called tahara, describe it as an immensely moving, spiritual experience.

Performing a tahara requires some training, and we have been privileged to have experienced members of other well established *Chevra Kadishas* speak at our meetings and assist at actual *taharas*.

The Or Zarua Chevra
Kadisha is currently researching
the possibility of securing a
cemetery plot for the synagogue.

Complex issues are involved, and we invite your knowledge and opinions.

Last but not least, our Chevra Kadisha, in the tradition of such societies the world over, held its first dinner last April at Va Bene restaurant. This convivial occasion is when we got to know one another better.
